Electric co-ops are led by the members they serve, which means you have a say in who governs our co-op. Here are four reasons why you should participate in director elections



NOTICE ANNUAL MEETING OF THE MEMBERS AND **ELECTION OF TRUSTEES**

In Accordance with Article II, Section 2.03 of the Bylaws, notice is hereby given that Central New Mexico Electric Cooperative, Inc. will hold the Annual Meeting of its Members at the Mountainair High School Gym in Mountainair, New Mexico on Saturday April 13, 2024.

Registration and voting are from 8:00 a.m. to 10:45 a.m. Business Meeting begins at 11:00 a.m.

Trustee positions to be filled are as follows:

- District No. 2: Township line between T7N and T8N, East Boundary: Hwy 285 South Boundary: Township line between T5N and T6N West Boundary: Coop boundary line. (Estancia area)
- District No. 4: North Boundary: Township line between T5N and T6N, East Boundary: Township line between T5N and T6N along Hwy 285 to Encino; along Hwy 3 from Encino to Township line between T3N and T4N; East along Township line between T3N and T4N to Range line between R14E and R15E South along Range line to Township T1N and T2N; South Boundary: Township line between T1N and T1S from West Coop boundary to Range line between R11E and R12E; North along Range line to Township line between T1N and T2N; East along Township line; West Boundary: Coop boundary. (Mountainair, Willard, and Corona areas)
- **District 6:** At Large comprising Districts 2, 3, 4, 7. (Estancia, Mountainair, Willard, Corona, and Vaughn areas.)

Candidates must live in the district for which they are running. Anyone wishing to file for candidacy must do so in either the Mountainair Office or the Moriarty Office on Thursday, March 14, 2024, before 4:00 p.m. Candidates must attend an informational orientation workshop to be qualified to have their name placed on the ballot. The date for the workshop will be scheduled after the filing for candidacy date.

Lengthen the life of your clothes dryer with regular cleaning. Clean the lint filter after every load, which improves air circulation and safety. Check the lint trap opening to ensure it's clean. Use a vacuum to remove any lint that's fallen inside the opening.

If you use dryer sheets, check the lint filter for residue buildup. Remove any residue with hot water and a nylon brush or toothbrush. Over time, dryer sheets can leave a film on the filter, which can affect the performance of the motor.
