Estancia Solar Project to Go On-Line

In October, the Estancia Solar Project will be on-line. The solar array just north of Estancia will provide renewable energy for Central New Mexico Electric Cooperative members. Unlike other renewable energy sites in our area, power generated by this facility will not be exported out of state but will come directly to CNMEC. This project has been several years in the making, with the Board and Staff looking at different options and ideas to have a renewable energy project on the books. Affordable Solar, a New Mexico company, was the best option for us to move forward with this type of project.

The project is 2.5 megawatts of solar and CNMEC negotiated a 25-year Purchase Power Agreement for .047 cent energy. The system is a ground mounted, single axis tracking photo-voltaic array with expected production of approximately 5,319,000 kWh (kilowatt hours) in the first year. The project sits on about 18 acres of land just north of Estancia. CNMEC does not own the land nor does CNMEC own any of the

solar equipment or facilities. CNMEC's only investment is the material and equipment to tie the solar facilities to our existing power lines.

CNMEC anticipates a savings of nearly \$30,000.00 in the first full year of production with a potential of a cumulative savings of more than \$1,000,000.00 over the lifetime of the agreement. We are extremely excited about this project and CNMEC will strive to continue being proactive in developing projects with minimal investment and with maximum return.
