High Winds can bring down tree limbs and power lines

- Stay at least 30 feet away

- Keep yourself and tools at least 10 feet from overhead powerlines.

Registration and voting are from 8:00 a.m. to 10:45 a.m. Business Meeting begins at 11:00AM Trustee positions to be filled with locations of districts are as follows:

District No. 1: Northeast Moriarty area

North Boundary: Old Hwy 66 to Hwy 41 then North along Hwy 41 to Coop boundary  
East Boundary:

From Coop boundary line on North, South along Hwy 285 to Township line between T7N and T8N

South Boundary: Township line between T7N and T8N

West Boundary: Coop boundary line. (Clements Rd.)

District No. 3: Vaughn – Encino area

North Boundary: Coop boundary

East Boundary: Coop boundary

South Boundary: Township line between T3N and T4N (6 miles South of Vaughn)

West Boundary: Hwy 3 from Township line T3N and T4N to Encino Hwy 28

North from Encino
